Yes. The College has instituted a comprehensive system for supporting and mentoring the students. The system identifies key areas related to academic, financial, psychological and talent and skill development. The support system functions through Departmental Mentoring system that assigns a mentor for every student. On an average each mentor has 16 – 20 wards depending on the strength of the department. It needs to be underscored that through the mentoring system necessary interventions have been made and our student's lives have been touched for betterment. The College has two fulltime counsellors whom students can approach after fixing appointments. A schedule is drawn and the counsellors meet each class to discuss common problems and means of tackling them. The students benefit from the interactive sessions. Each department has a trained staff counsellor who is available to students on all days after the college working hours. Mentors meet their wards at least three times a semester for academic and personal guidance. The meetings are recorded in the mentor record. The students are also free to approach the staff members at any time. Students, who need special attention in terms of monetary help or emotional/ academic/ personal support, are assisted according to their needs. The academic counselling enables both slow learners and advanced learners to achieve their goals. The class teachers and the course teachers analyze the academic problems to devise ways for the academic improvement. Life Guidance Programme is conducted for outgoing students by inviting experts in the field. Counselling is done for sports women as well. Apart from counsellors, medical practitioners are also consulted.

Fatima College has a well maintained and sprawling campus of 37 acres located in Vilangudi, Madurai. The College has excellent infrastructure facilitating a teaching learning environment. In order to make optimum use of the Infrastructure, the college functions in two shifts Shift I from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and Shift II from 12.30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. Certificate and diploma courses are conducted from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon and 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. for Shift II and Shift I respectively. During weekends and holidays, the campus is utilized for campus drives, Central and State competitive exams such as NET, SET, TNPSC, UPSC and Bank examinations. The Institution focuses on its goals and ensures proper planning, budgeting and implementation of the annual budget for the optimal utilization of the resources. The Management Committee foresees the requirements and needs of the college in consultation with the College

Council. It prepares proposals and budgets and gets the approval of the President of St. Joseph's Society, Madurai for implementation. The plan is presented and resolution for approval is passed by the Governing Body. Systematic maintenance of the facilities is ensured by rectifying complaints recorded in the Complaints Register. Events are conducted in different Halls like Golden Jubilee Auditorium, Audio Visual Room, San Jose Seminar Hall, San Jose Hall No.5, Language Labs and Smart Rooms. The event schedules along with the requirements of physical facilities are listed in advance in the Programme Diary kept in the office. All departments can use the halls for meetings, seminars, conferences, ICT based teaching learning, intra and intercollegiate competitions. The entire college under goes an Annual Stock checking. Staff are involved in this process of stock checking to verify the available resources with the meticulously maintained stock registers. The institution has a counselling centre with qualified counsellors to give personal counselling for both students and staff. The college has a wellconstructed open air stadium with a stage, Gymnasium, Sports' students Lounge, and Indoor stadium properly maintained and utilised. The institution has appointed qualified and trained technical staff, support staff and Nonteaching assistants for regular maintenance of the infrastructure facilities and equipments. System Engineers appointed undertake maintenance of computers and accessories. Support staff are rigorously engaged as per systematic schedule for ensuring cleanliness of the campus. Ecofriendly initiatives in the campus include installation of 8 Kilowatt ongrid Solar Power System and Biogas Plant installed in May 2018 to produce cooking gas and organic manure. The Administrative Block is entirely powered by solar panels.

ROSA Reach Out to the Society through Action is the vibrant extension wing of Fatima College which works for the upliftment of the 16 villages in the neighbourhood. This community service is an offcampus programme. The 3credit student activity focusses on women, children and youth covering areas such as health, literacy, women empowerment environmental awareness. These activities not only help in transforming the villages but also provide an opportunity for experiential learning taking the lab to the land. Recognising the dedicated service rendered, the MHRD has selected Fatima College as a Participating Institution under UBA 2.0 from April 2017 onwards. In consultation with the District Collector of Madurai, 5 villages namely Kondaiyampatti, Nedungulam, Vadugapatti, Ambalathadi and Thirumalnatham were chosen for the UBA programme. Schedules are drawn up listing specific activities for the target groups. The students and staff are wholeheartedly involved in the various community programmes. A special feature of these extension activities is the follow up. Students study the impact of the activities and suggest measures for follow up. Ties with the villagers are maintained and they are invited to certain programmes organised by the college in the campus. Young girls from the villages are motivated to pursue their education in Fatima College. Through ROSA students are sensitized to reach out to society. The leadership skills are also honed. It is a winwin situation for Fatima College and the neighbourhood.
